Project Objective

The objective of the project is to increase the availability and access to the basic needs of target families through the production and selling of quality products to manage their livelihood activities. In doing so the project works on increasing market accessibility, and skill development of the women entrepreneurs. It also focuses on improving the capacity and moral standards of participating families through life development skills like education and nutrition of children.

Main Activities

The main activities of the project starts with selecting beneficiaries and group formation. Different types of training and workshops are conducted to make them efficient and skilled to be an entrepreneur. These trainings and workshops include topics like organization building and organization management, entrepreneurship development and business planning, skill development, (poultry rearing, cow fattening, fresh dairying, and handicrafts) etc. Some knowledge sharing meetings are also arranged at community levels. Providing emergency health support, installation of sanitary latrines, installation of deep tube wells for safe water, distribution of seeds and worm manure for homestead gardening, tree plantation (fruit, wood) etc. also included to this project.

Method of Implementation

- Beneficiary Selection using the PRA method
- Formation of 10 Women Entrepreneurs' Teams of 30 members each
- Formation of Shobuj Polly Youth Development Association including 25–30 members
- Weekly meetings with Nari Udyog Dal for life skills discussions
- Monthly Meeting of Shobuj Polly Youth Development Association
- Opening 10 bank accounts for 10 women initiative groups
- Opening a bank account for the Shobuj Polly Youth Development Association
- Inspire and Ensure Team Savings
- Establish and Repair the Community Business Center of Shobuj Polly Youth Development Organization
